My uncle's plantation

Ten months after Uncle N'Dabian's death, Climbié and his uncle returned to the field; the bush had taken the whole farm. "I had to start from scratch. You'll see! Ah, my child, there is always work to be done. Every day I struggle against the lianas, the weeds, the thorns*, against the rain, wind and sun, the insects, the harmful animals, [...] I have to control everything night and day".

5 Does the wind blow hard? I say to myself: "that wind will make the flowers of the coffee trees fall, and the harvest will be bad. Is the rain early? Then it is hard to burn the fields, hard to grow food crops, and so there is famine. On the other hand, if the rain is too late, there is still a risk of famine because the time for planting may pass. A tree falls. Did it crush my coffee? My cocoa? Your head has to work as hard as your hands. I have to see everything myself, to be sure that it all goes well. To 10 create a plantation is not a joke, my child..."

They had arrived. [...] the coffee trees were moving in the wind, like waves of the sea "Did you notice the difference in that gust of wind just now?[...]It's a wind that announces rain. Look over there. Do you see the heavy cloud on the horizon, just above that big tree?" "yes".
