Read the text below and do all the activities that follow it.

In the past decade, the Government of Burundi has embarked on ensuring the participation of women in Burundi's public life. Around 30 percent of women are now involved in public service at the top level in the country.

Since the introduction of free primary education in 2005, the Government of Burundi, with the support of UNICEF and other technical and financial partners has made significant progress in achieving gender parity at the primary school level.

Nonetheless, as children moving towards the higher educational ladder, girls are much underrepresented. Currently, the secondary enrolment ratio for girls is 15 percent, compared to 21 percent for boys.

As emphasized throughout the 2011 campaign, education brings a multitude of benefits to girls, women, their family, community and ultimately to their country. Educating girls is the most effective tool to reduce infant and maternal mortality, and to combat HIV/AIDS, child trafficking, exploitation and violence of which they are the silent victims.

The "education for all" week is celebrated across the world. In Burundi the activities included: community dialogue on girl's rights to education, the importance of female literacy, sport and cultural activities; expert panels; and the dissemination of education materials.
