#### AN EXAMPLE OF INJUSTICE

Of course, I could not complain, knowing that my tormentor would revenge on me and also not wishing the other boys to think that I was taking advantage of my father's position.

In spite of all this, Yao was a cheat. Whenever there was a written work, Yao would want to look at my work and copy, but I resisted as best as I could. One day, during the end-of-term examinations, Yao wanted to cheat as before, pushing himself very close to me with the intention of copying, but I prevented him by hiding my work. When all his efforts failed, he employed another trick to get the desired effect.
